Ms Victoria Sheehan

Transportation Research Board (TRB) - Executive Director



Victoria Sheehan is the executive director of the Transportation Research Board of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine. The Transportation Research Board (TRB) provides leadership in transportation improvements and innovation through trusted, timely, impartial, and evidence-based information exchange, research, and advice regarding all modes of transportation.

Sheehan came to the National Academies from the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (DOT), where she was commissioner for seven years. Responsible for an operating budget of over \$650 million, she oversaw a staff of more than 1,600 employees representing diverse areas such as aeronautics, rail, transit, construction, operations, finance, and administration. Her team led the development of New Hampshire's Ten-Year Transportation Plan, and Sheehan worked directly with the governor, general court, and executive council to ensure it would address the state's growing needs. Before joining the New Hampshire DOT, Sheehan spent 10 years at the Massachusetts DOT leading strategic planning and highway performance, managing the bridge consulting program, and overseeing an eight-year, \$3 billion Accelerated Bridge Program. Sheehan served as president of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) for 2020-2021 and has been an active board member in a range of other professional organizations. She holds a master's degree in structural engineering and architecture from the University of Edinburgh in Scotland.

Engr. Abimbola Akinajo is a chartered Civil Engineer (both in the UK and Nigeria) with over three decades post qualification experience, gained substantially in the design and delivery of major transport (both Rail and Road) infrastructure projects.

She earned a B.Sc. (Hons) Civil Engineering from the University of Lagos, Nigeria after which she proceeded to the United Kingdom where she started her engineering career.

She began her engineering career at WS Atkins Consulting in the UK as a Graduate Engineer and moved on to be a Project Engineer with Robert West Consulting, a Design Manager with Fluor Daniel Limited, and finally a Project Manager

with London Underground Limited working on railway infrastructure projects for over 20 years. At London Underground, she delivered many high-profile rail infrastructure projects including,

- Major London underground Rail bridge replacement projects
- The Connect Project – (implementation of updated communications systems on the entire London Underground system),
- Upgrading the Blackfriars station for the Thames Link project, and
- London Overground interface project among others.

In 2009, she became the Managing Director of Nexant Consulting Limited and grew the consulting firm into a reputable quality-driven consulting firm with an excellent track record with its clients.

Engr. Mrs. Akinajo has extensive experience in liaising and coordinating with different stakeholders to ensure the timely delivery of projects to program, budget, and specification.

Engr. Abimbola is a Fellow of the Nigeria Society of Engineers (FNSE), a member of the Institution of Civil Engineers UK (MICE), and the Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN).

She was appointed the Managing Director of LAMATA in October 2019 and has delivered life-impacting transport projects that have accentuated Governor Babajide Sanwo-Olu's first pillar of the THEMES ++ agenda – Traffic Management and Transportation. These include the completion of the Lagos Rail Mass Transit (LRMT) Blue Line project, the implementation of the Red Line Rail Project, the facilitation of infrastructure i.e Bus Terminals, Depots, and Bus Stops to improve public Transportation, the launch of E-Ticketing powered by Cowry Card, and other various projects.

Dr Allyson Lawless



Allyson Lawless is a civil engineer who in her early career worked in consulting, structural steelwork design and construction and later developed and supplied structural and civil engineering software.

As the first female president of the South African Institution of Civil Engineering in 2000 she became concerned about the lack of development of civil engineering graduates and commenced a new research and training career.

She has published several seminal documents including 'Numbers and Needs' which looked at civil engineering skills in South Africa, a sequel 'Numbers and Needs in Local Government' and in 2018, researched Engineering Numbers and Needs in the SADC Region. Each document has highlighted the growing challenges in terms of developing and harnessing engineering skills.

In 2009 she was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Engineering by Stellenbosch University for her contribution to civil engineering and in 2012 an International Fellowship was conferred on her by the Royal Academy of Engineering in London.

She has served on many committees and councils including the University of Venda, the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA), the Human Resource Development Council (HRDCSA) and has served as a SANRAL Board Member.
